
• On May 8th, five members attended a Book Fair at the Marble Falls Library. While sales may not have been the best, we did make numerous contacts and met with many potential members.

Faced with students who are often sick, exhausted, or distracted, she quickly realizes that teaching is more than delivering content as it requires humility, creativity, and responsiveness to unique needs. With limited resources, she integrates science standards with students' interests and their babies' needs, finding joy in the challenge. A DNA lab using Everclear highlights her innovative, risky strategies. The book captures the humor, struggles and triumphs of an unconventional classroom.

Georgetown Public Library and the San Gabriel Writers' League will present the 2^{nd} session in the, "Let's Get Started" writing series.

The session, entitled, "Honing your Writing Skills" is on June 1st from 1:00 – 3:00. Discussion points will include the importance and structure of the opening sentence, paragraph, chapter, and chapter breaks. Participants will be led through point of view, passive vs. active voice, unnecessary explanations, and writing with emotion. The proper use of slang, alliteration, dialogue, and dialect will also be discussed.

Subsequent sessions on September 7 and December 7 will guide participants through the main structure and storyline of the book and editing the manuscript. The final session is entitled, "Let's Get It Published."

Formatting Your Self-Published Book

Self-publishing is easier than ever before, but if you don't have the skills to do your own formatting, it can cost you money to hire someone. Learn how to prepare your Word document manuscript so it is eBook or paperback-ready for uploading to KDP or Ingram Spark. In this class, you will learn how to set margins, choose your book size, enter headers and footers, create a table of contents, plus some Christian writing specifics on how to format Bible verses, etc. **Bring your laptop.**


Paula divides her time between Texas and Rio Bravo, Mexico. Find Paula on Facebook, Instagram, and her blog, "Real people with real-life struggles."
